Centennial Trail: Arlington to Bryant opens

Snohomish County Parks celebrated the completion of the newest section of the Centennial Trail. The new section stretches four miles along the abandoned railroad right-of-way and terminates at the Bryant trailhead and was built by Strider Construction. "Thousands of individuals and families will take advantage of this wonderful park asset," said County Executive Aaron Reardon. The trail is a paved, multipurpose recreational trail serving walkers, bicyclists, equestrians and others. The final four miles north to the Skagit County line, as well as <a href="the gap in the trail between 172nd Street NE in south Arlington and to 152nd Street NE in north Marysville, is scheduled to be complete by the end of next summer," said Snohomish County Parks director Tom Teigen (Information obtained from The Everett Herald and Snohomish County Parks).

Next up, the 2010 Washington State Bicycle and Pedestrian Documentation Project Oct. 5, 6 & 7, 7-9am & 4-6pm. (This by Erica Meurk on the Cascade Bike Blog)
Cascade will also be conducting statewide bicycle and pedestrian counts on October 5 – 7. We had more than 250 volunteers last year, and we're hoping for even more this year. Ride Around Washington

This year's ride was around the northeastern part of the state, sometimes called the Forgotten Corner. The ride started in Newport. We crossed the Pend Oreille river into Idaho, turned north and promptly returned to Washington. We paralleled the river for some distance and crossed into Ione for lunch. Then back across the river and up the hill to



Sullivan Lake. Then north along the lake a few miles and back down the hill to Metaline Falls, ending the day. Day 2 took us over the Selkirks on Hwy 20 with a lunch break at the pass. Then down the other side followed by a loop north, west to US 395 and south to finish the day in Kettle Falls. Day 3 we rode north on 395 and crossed into Canada. There was a strenuous US-only option for those not wishing to go into Canada. In Canada we turned west on BC 3 and stopped for lunch in Grand Forks. Our food trucks could not go into Canada, so they gave us each \$10 to buy our own lunch. After Grand Forks we turned south, back into the US on 21. The first town we hit was Curlew, where the sheriff warned us there was a major thunderstorm on the way. We continued south on 21, then turned up the hill to Curlew State Park. The faster riders beat the storm, but I sure didn't. We coasted, soaking wet, into the park, to applause from those already there, under the tarps. Eventually the storm passed and we got our dinner and pitched our tents. Day 4 was an optional rest day. Those who wanted to could take about a 70 mile loop thru Wauconda. I opted for the rest day. Day 5 we headed south, then west over the pass to Colville Agency. As we crossed the pass the weather turned beastly hot. We reached Coulee Dam and camped on the high school field. Those who wanted to could walk into town and view the light show on the dam. The final day started with a ride across the dam. This is no longer a routine thing. Due to security measures it's closed to regular traffic with permits issued only occasionally. Cascade secured one, but we had to go as a peleton in about a 30 minute time frame. Also no panniers or handlebar bags. We had to put these in a pickup truck which transported them separately to the other side. After picking up our bags we continued southwest to Coulee City and a lunch stop at Dry Falls State Park. Beastly hot again. After lunch we continued SW on 17 to our final destination at Soap Lake. A very substantial week's exercise.
