## January Rides: Weekends & Weekdays

#### **WEEKEND RIDES**

#### **WEEKDAY RIDES**

Tuesdays, January 5, 12, 19, 26 – PreRide to the Noon Ride Meet at Silver Lake Bicycle Centre for a 10:30am start, routes will vary. These loop rides are set up to return riders for the start of the Silver Lake Noon Rides. Food stop follows the Noon ride. Distance 12 -15 mile loops, A/B terrain, low-moderate pace with regroups. #### RIDE GUIDE

#### **PACE**

Easyunder 10 mphSocial10-12 mphSteady12-14 mphModerate14-16 mphBrisk16-18 mphStrenuous> 18 mph

#### **TERRAIN**

"A" Mostly flat: Flat or gentle grades only (trails, Norman Rd)

"B" Rolling: Most climbs are short and easy (Granite Falls, Kitsap) "C" Hills: Frequent steeper and/or longer hills (Whidbey Island)

"D" Difficult: Many hills, long, steep grades (RAMROD, mt. pass)
Pace is based on speed on flat ground. Contact the Ride Leader if you are unsure whether a ride is right for you.

#### **Pedal Pushers**

### Prez Sez...

I am a buy – and bike – local kind of person. That's why I belong to B.I.K.E.S. Club of Snohomish County.

I have been an active member of the statewide bicycling community since 1999, but I have never been a member of Cascade Bicycle Club. I have ridden Seattle to Portland three times (that's enough), enjoyed receiving and reading the Cascade Courier thanks to Bike to Work connections for many years, and attended many a Bike Expo, Bike Swap and Tour de France viewing courtesy of Cascade organizers.

I guess I never joined because I figured Cascade was big enough without me. Now, with the <u>merger of Cascade with Washington Bikes</u>, the organization is even bigger. And I am one of the new members transferred over from Washington Bikes.

While I understand the reasons behind the merger and believe in the good intentions of all parties, I am concerned about the implications of an even bigger Cascade seeking to have a statewide impact. It will be hard for them to leave room on the ride calendar for smaller events like McClinchy, hard to help local advocates without co-opting us, hard to listen and respond to the diverse needs of so many different bicyclist-members.

So far, though, I can report that Cascade has responded well to my concerns about them having a monopoly on bike event promotion. They are giving us a 50% off nonprofit rate for our McClinchy flyer insertion into the Cascade Courier. The leaders and staff of the organization are anxious to expand their focus and do right by riders around the state.

Maybe in that spirt, this is the year for me to ride a Cascade event again. (I haven't forgotten the 5 pretzel-limit at a rest stop the year I did STP in one day, but maybe I can let bygones be bygones).

On the flip side, if you are among those who have only ridden Cascade events, expand your horizons in 2016 to discover the many other rides, routes, and more generous food stops: ) offered by other organizations.

There's a big world out there ready to be seen by bike.\*

### **Washington Bikes Merges with Cascade**

Excerpted from a letter to clubs from the board of Washington Bikes:

On Tuesday, Dec. 8, 2015, the Washington Bikes Board of Directors voted to <u>merge with Cascade Bicycle Club</u>. We are proud to join forces to become the nation's largest statewide bicycle nonprofit and are confident the merger will result in greater capacity to work with you in the future. Engagement with local clubs and advocacy groups will continue to be a priority of the merged organization.

We believe this merger will allow our mission to thrive and grow for several reasons.

- The Washington Bikes Board voted to approve the 2016 legislative agenda, previously reviewed with the Legislative and Statewide Issues Committee (which includes BIKES Club member Warren Bare). Former WaBikes now Cascade staffer Blake Trask will work to implement this agenda with all the strategic partners who have helped make us successful in Olympia.
- Former WaBikes Barb Chamberlain will lead the planning of the 2016 Bike Summit, which will include sessions and activities focused on collaboration and partnership with local clubs, along with statewide outreach and development of our work in bike travel/tourism. **Save the date and plan to attend: March 21-22 at the Tacoma Convention Center.**
- Current Washington Bikes Board members will participate in the development of a new strategic plan for the organization in March-April 2016. **You and other stakeholders will be invited to participate through meetings and other engagement opportunities.** Please continue to be a part of shaping our collective future.
- Three current members of the Washington Bikes board of directors—John Pope (Anacortes), Ted Inkley (Seattle), and Marie Dymkoski (Pullman)—will join the board of the merged organization for a one-year appointment effective January 1, 2016.

We hope you will continue to engage with and support our mission in 2016 and beyond.
